Dear Mr. Neltner:

Thank you for your letter of July 17, 2023, to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) regarding the lead-sheathed telecom and power cables across the nation.

On July 26, 2023, EPA's Office of Enforcement and Compliance Assurance sent letters pursuant to Section 104(e)(2) of the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA) to Verizon and AT&T legally requiring both companies to quickly provide EPA with key information to understand the nature and extent of lead contamination related to this equipment. We requested, for example, results of inspections the companies have undertaken, as well as sampling results and data. In addition, EPA is coordinating closely with states to conduct sampling in various locations. We take these concerns very seriously and will continue to move expeditiously under our statutory authorities to protect the public from potential legacy pollution.
