Current Federal Policy Landscape

- Current federal grant programs and upcoming grant renewals: **varying statuses**
- FY26 appropriations: **ongoing discussions in Congress**
- Federal staffing: **some reductions have occurred; CDC RIFs pulled back**

FY26 Appropriations

- Currently, the Senate and House are passing appropriations bills through committee
- Once Congress is back from recess in the fall, we will see more action on appropriations
